New, Life Saving Defibrillator Installed on Fordlands

Road: A new community defibrillator has been installed at Cemetery Lodge on Fordlands Road. This was made possible with funds raised by Mrs Nic Dunn, who initiated the project, her supporters, a Parish Council grant application to Yorkshire Ambulance Service Charity, Fulford & Heslington Ward Committee for a community grant of £220 and Kevin Burbidge of KBE for the generous donation of his time and electrical expertise.

The Defibrillator is located on the external wall of Cemetery Lodge to the right-hand side of the office entrance within the pedestrian access gate to the Cemetery grounds. The Parish Council will fund the ongoing maintenance.

Fulford's Open Spaces

Parish Field Public Consultation Update: A high number of responses was received from Fulford residents to the recent Public Consultation for the School Lane Parish Field proposals. From the 3 options presented, Option C proved the favourite and the design process is now underway to develop the aspects of Option C incorporating the more popular elements of the feedback received. It is hoped that planning approval will be sought in Summer 2023, with a start date in Spring 2024. The Parish Council website and the Facebook page will continue to provide updates as and when plans develop and the Council welcomes feedback from residents throughout the process.

Fordlands Road Playing Field: In response to residents' feedback following an unlawful trespass onto the field, the Parish Council has installed two bollards at the vehicular gate to protect the field and from further incidents. An existing bench has been located away from the neighbouring properties, closer to the play equipment to reduce noise disturbance. The mast of the Viking Longboat play equipment has temporarily been removed for repairs. The community noticeboard at the entrance to the field has been repaired and reinstalled so is available for residents' notices and information again. Plans continue with the community wood project at Fordlands Road and updates will be added to the website and on Facebook as well as in the minutes of Parish Council meetings.

Fulford Village Green: The Village Green is by the river, on the city side of Landings Lane. There are picnic benches and steps down to a beach. One area has been mown and the hay collected to help promote the growth of wildflowers. St Nick's have worked with the Parish Council and volunteers to clear brambles, plant tansy for the tansy beetle population and sow wildflower sees that should come into bloom next year. The Tansy Beetle Action Group board describing the life cycle of this endangered species disappeared recently and will be replaced. York is the tansy beetle's stronghold so the more people who know about this beautiful creature and protect its habitat, the better.

From St Nicks:

Fulford Ings is the area of floodplain to the east of the River Ouse between St Oswalds Road in the north and the A64 in the south. **St Nicks**, as part of the Green Corridors York project, have been helping landowners and land managers with the management of green spaces all along the river in York, including Fulford. Parts of the Ings are a designated Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI) due to the rare sequence of plant communities found here. Fulford Ings contains alluvial grassland meadow on higher ground, a transitional zone of rich fen meadow, and swamp in the lowest lying areas furthest from the river.

Traditionally, Ings were managed by farmers cutting and removing a hay crop, followed by grazing with cattle until autumn, or until the ground became too wet. This helped reduce soil nutrient levels, encouraging a greater diversity of plants. If Ings are left unmanaged, vigorous plants progressively dominate the habitats, dead plant matter accumulates, less competitive species are suppressed and botanical diversity is reduced. Scrub and trees begin to dominate and over time the meadows disappear.

Consistent management of the Ings has not taken place for a several years due to funding issues, the pandemic and logistical challenges. This year, management has resumed on parts of the Ings, with the northern end of the site being cut and baled. St Nicks has held volunteer sessions on the less accessible parts to control nettles and balsam by hand, seeded a big patch of the Village Green with wildflowers and intends to plant a lot of tansy. Over winter, we will be carrying out tree works to stop the boundary hedges encroaching on the grasslands and next spring we will be balsam bashing for days on end!

Hopefully, management will continue in the future to restore and enhance the rare habitats present, with benefits for both wildlife and people. Wouldn't it be magical if ground nesting birds such as curlew returned to the lngs to raise their chicks?

Fulford Social Hall Proposals for a Renovation Project

Fulford Social Hall on School Lane provides a venue for classes, social events, Fulford Show and other activities. The Parish Council recognises it needs upgrading, so we have engaged a local architect, Phil Bixby of Constructive Individuals, to carry out a study looking at all aspects of the building: its fabric, its energy use and, importantly, its role in the community.*

Phil has already consulted with current users of the building and members of the community (you may have met him at Fulford Show!) to understand what the building means to local people and their aspirations for it. He will provide a detailed energy appraisal as well different options for the structure and lay-out of the hall depending on how it might be used in future (a café, film showings, a reading room?). Meanwhile, Councillors are visiting other community venues in York to learn about how they are used and managed. We are also exploring different ways to fund improvements, as it will be a costly business.

We will continue to consult with local people at every stage of the process, so that improvements to the building make it of value to the local community for many years to come. You are welcome to email the Parish Council with your ideas (clerk@fulfordpc.org.uk)



Social Hall Renovation Image







Image of Defibrillator Location


